Reflections on Readings for The Second Sunday of Lent

"This Is My Chosen Son; Listen To Him"

As our Lenten journey continues, we look at the key events in salvation history as well as the key events in Jesus' life and ministry. In our readings this Sunday, we look at two manifestations of our awesome God - the sacred covenant God formed with Abraham and the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor.



In our first reading (**Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18**), we hear of Abram's (later renamed Abraham) encounter with God as God promised him countless descendants and also gave him the Promised Land. God and Abram enter into a sacred covenant using an ancient covenantal ritual to establish an unbreakable bond. Much like the disciples in our Gospel reading, Abram was enveloped in a "deep, terrifying darkness". In his act of believing the word of God, Abram, at that moment, became our father in faith.

In our Epistle reading (**Philippians 3:17 - 4:1**), Saint Paul encourages us to follow the example he and others have set for us, unlike those who "conduct themselves as enemies of the cross." Standing firm in the Lord, we are no longer mere earthly beings but citizens of heaven as we "await our savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." At that time, Jesus will "change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body".

In our Gospel reading (**Luke 9:28-36**) we hear the awesome story of the Transfiguration. Jesus led His chosen three disciples up the mountain and was transfigured before their eyes as He revealed His glory. They "became frightened" at the sight but then wanted to build three tents and savor the moment. There is rich symbolism in this experience, as Moses and Elijah are said to have represented the Law (Torah) and the Prophets of Israel. They discussed Jesus' "exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem", thus connecting all of Jewish salvation history to the final exodus of freedom from sin and death through the cross and resurrection.

Many of us have had some encounter with God that has left us filled with awe and wonder. While we may want to savor the moment, we know we have to come down from the mountain, as did the Apostles from the transfiguration, and go about living our daily lives, just differently.

O.C.I.A. ~ Scrutinies

Our O.C.I.A. **Candidates**, Christa Abugasea, Marium Abugasea Heidt, Madeline McClure, Jeffrey Riedl, Jason Tucker and Natalie Zazubec and the **Elect**, Lindsey Kester and Amelia Scalzo have reached the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. This period began on the first Sunday of Lent, when we celebrated the RITE of Election and Calling to Continuing Conversion at Sacred Heart Cathedral on Sunday, March 9.

This time of purification and enlightenment is given to a "more intense preparation of spirit and heart, which has the character of recollection rather than of catechesis, and is intended to purify hearts and minds by examination of conscience and penitence. This period is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior."

Quoted from The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults #139

Scrutinies

The scrutinies are rites for examining oneself and a call to repentance. The elect will look at themselves to find anything that is keeping them from Jesus and ask Jesus to heal and strengthen them.

We will celebrate the Scrutinies with our elect at weekend masses the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. The candidates and the elect, along with our congregation, will hear and reflect on the Gospel stories to discover how the stories apply to themselves as they prepare for the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil.

The third Sunday of Lent, we celebrate the first scrutiny. The Gospel story is Jesus meeting a Samaritan woman at the well. We see Jesus in this Gospel as **Living Water**. The elect will be attending the 5:00 PM mass on Saturday, March 22.

On the fourth Sunday of Lent we celebrate the second scrutiny, the Gospel story is Jesus healing a man who was born blind. Jesus refers to himself as **The Light of the World**. The elect will attend the 8:00 AM mass on Sunday, March 30.

The third scrutiny is on the fifth Sunday of Lent. The Gospel story, is Jesus raising his friend Lazarus back to life. Jesus is **The Resurrection and the Life**. The elect will be at the 10:30 AM mass on Sunday, April 6.

Please join us in praying for our candidates and elect and their families as they enter this final stage before becoming full members of the Roman Catholic Church Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil Mass on April 19.

Did you know?

Catechumen is a term used to refer to those preparing to be baptized and receive the other sacraments of initiation of the Catholic Church.

After the RITE of Election, which was celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent, these individuals are called **The Elect** indicating their readiness for a period of more intense reflection, purification, and enlightenment.

Candidates are those who are already Christians by baptism and are seeking to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They will receive the sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist.

The sacraments will be received at the Easter Vigil Mass.

New scams are being identified every day. It is essential to protect ourselves and our loved ones from scams, fraud, and identify theft by being informed.

Here are a few tips to be aware of:

- Never pay money to collect money, prizes, or other benefits.
- If someone online asks for money, no matter the reason or your relationship with the person—stop! Don't send it.
- If you wish to donate to a charity, give local.
- Verify a government agency by hanging up the phone and then calling them directly.
- Never allow remote access to your computer, cell phone, or other electronic devices.
- Caller ID is not reliable. The number you see could be part of a scam.
- Do not mail cash or purchase gift cards for payment of any kind.
- Do not share medical or personal information including your Social Security number over the phone or computer.
- Delete unsolicited emails or text messages without clicking on any links.
- Never give personal information unless YOU made the call.
